Synopsis of Rev Miller's Sermon

August 24, 2014

"When Faith Grows Cold"

Judges 16:15-21


2 Timothy 1:2-8

2 Timothy 1:6 "Rekindle the gift of God that is within you..."



What does a Christian do when his or her faith grows cold? How do you "Rekindle the gift of God"? ... When church work has become mechanical ... when giving loses its sense of satisfaction ... when praying becomes meaningless ... when for several Sundays it is difficult to get out of bed to go to church?

Faith goes gradually and we may not even be aware of its leaving. We all have experienced periods of time when our faith became cooler than we realized. God hasn't moved: Jesus has not gone anywhere. If we don't feel close to God anymore, we can be very certain that it is because we are responsible.



We never lose our faith all at once. – It is the little compromises we make that erode our convictions and allow our faith to gradually weaken. The Bible is full of those kinds of stories. Faith can silently just slip away.

You are not the only one whose faith goes weaker at times. Even the great ones in the Bible experienced faith problems. Abraham once resorted to a lie to save his own skin. Simon Peter behaved himself in such a manner that the Lord would say, "Get thee behind me, Satan." When we are preoccupied with selfish concerns we become spiritually ill and the springs of faith dry up. We cannot recover the vitality of Christian faith until we move beyond our own selfishness.

When you see this happening, try something great for God. If you have wondered how you can feel close to God keep in mind that it is you who must take the next step. Take a bold step forward for God. It is time for you to respond to the warmth of God's spirit and help make your life exciting again. Pick yourself up and try something for God's sake. Your faith in God can become rekindled.

Dear Father, we cannot expect to stay on top of the mountain all the time. When we find ourselves in the valley, help us to take steps necessary to regain the peace and the joy you have offered to us. Dear Father, renew a right spirit within us today. Amen.


