PASTOR'S PEN

To My Awesome Church Family,


The Lenten season is rapidly approaching in a couple of weeks. Is it me or did we just celebrate Christmas a few weeks ago? (giggle...giggle) The new year here at Salem is really getting ready to rev up to high speed with all the things going on. I can't believe all of the activity and ministry that actually goes on here.

I'm so excited to share that we have some persons who are officially becoming members of the Salem United Methodist Church family on February 25th!! We also have a Confirmation class beginning the first Saturday of Lent for our young people to confirm their faith. We are growing y'all!

I want to thank Salem for all of your prayers for my family. I want to personally update you on what is going on in the Kirkland household. On January 6th Reggie had a lumbar puncture (spinal tap) as a last resort test to see if there is anything that could be done for his deteriorated physical condition as he has now become 24/7 daily care. Reggie's neurologist called us Sunday evening (January 21st) and said his spinal fluid shows he has a rare condition called CIDP – Chronic Inflammatory Demyelinating Polyneuropathy. The cerebral spinal fluid showed that the proteins are alarmingly high. Standard range is 15-45 mg/dL and Reggie's results were 453 mg/dL. The neurologist who is in his twenty-plus years of practice says he has never seen results this high. He wants to start treatment as soon as possible. We asked for prayers that the very expensive treatment [IVIg Intravenous Immunoglobulin - \$8K per dose] is approved by insurance {it was approved} so the infusions can now begin very soon and that permanent nerve damage has not completely occurred so that there can be some improvement in his physical condition. I'm not quite sure of what will happen, but God knows.

More times than not, I can feel that someone or some people are praying for us. I feel the love of the Lord and His people. This soothes and calms my feelings of defeat. Now, it is time to answer your question.

Since I have lived well over half of a century, I have begun to learn that no matter how much I fuss, no matter how many temper tantrums I throw or how bad I choose to feel about a situation, God is still in control. If I want the Lord to know how very much I love and trust Him, I actually want to be glad about whatever the Lord has in store for me. 
