

"Some Attitude Adjustments"

Jonah 4:1-11 Philippians 3:12-16

Philippians 3:14 "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God, in Jesus Christ."

Jonah 4:9a And God said to Jonah, "Is it right for you to be

angry because your plant died?"

They are hard to be around, and they need an attitude adjustment. We may not be that crude; but all of us from time to time need an "Attitude Adjustment," to take stock of where we have been, where we are going and how we can do better.

This is precisely what the Apostle Paul was talking about in Philippians 3. He said, "I know that I'm not perfect, but I'm trying my best to be better because I have committed my life to Christ and He deserves the best. So, forgiving what lies behind, forgetting my failures, forgetting my shortcomings; I strain forward to what lies ahead, and I press on toward the goal for the prize. Toward the Upward call of God in Jesus Christ."

Attitude is critical. People approach God with an attitude of anger; an attitude of indifference and an attitude of trust. All of us at times get mad at ourselves and at those around us. When we pray we should listen to God. He will still your troubled mind. Many times we fail to pay attention to God and his will for our lives. People can be so wrapped up in themselves that God just doesn't matter. Attitude is a reflection of the desires of the heart.

The Christian Faith tells us to have an attitude of trust and it will change your life. Always be aware of your attitude because it is an indicator of the contents of your heart. We can trust God. I think trust is one of the keys to life. It is about counting on God and believing that nothing can separate us, not even death can separate us from God and God's love. Living out this belief, no matter what happens will change our hearts and therefore change our attitude toward God and Others.

It is my prayer that God will give us an attitude adjustment when we need it; adjusting our attitudes to helpfulness, to appreciation and to trust in God.
