PASTOR'S PEN

To My Awesome Church Family,

Welcome to the season of Pentecost! May the reviving fire of the Holy Spirit continue to fuel our church family and friends. Speaking of *revive*, last month on May 7th we started a six-week study called *Revival: Faith as Wesley Lived It* written by Adam Hamilton. The revised meeting days for this study schedule are May 7, 14, then June 4, 11, 18 and ending on June 25th. So far we have had a great time meeting from 6:00-7:30 pm in May. It is really neat that Salem is becoming more equipped for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that will soon take place so we will experience growth in our ministry and faith over this next year together.

For the past couple months we've had musical guests who have been absolutely awesome. For our prayer warriors, I'm asking for prayers for the Indiana United Methodist Annual Conference this year in Indianapolis. It should be pretty interesting. For those wondering about Reggie, I announced during a community time last month that all of the special treatments (infusions and other medicines) for his CIDP (Chronic Inflammatory Demyelinating Polyneuropathy) have been stopped. There has been no improvement and weekly, we are seeing more symptoms of this debilitating disease. He is now experiencing gastroparesis which is believed to be caused by damage to the vagus nerve that controls the stomach muscles and digestive tract. With his dementia comes paraplegia from the chest down, incontinence x2 and lack of mobility. Reggie is doing the best that he can to accept that he requires 24/7 care, and we try to appreciate every moment we have together. (Continued on page 3.)

ASK THE PASTOR

Dear Pastor Gina,

I was wondering why is it that the scarves on the communion table and the pulpit change from time-to-time, and how does someone know when to change them?

Sincerely, Not A Decorator

Dear Not A Decorator,

Thank you for your awesome question. I'm pretty sure there are several other people who were wondering the same thing. As Methodists, we follow the Christian year for scheduling and planning. The colors symbolizing the days and seasons of the Christian year are used for stoles and other vestments, altar cloths and other paraments, and church decorations.



The Christian year has two cycles: The Christmas Cycle (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter Cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost.) Within each cycle are a preparatory season symbolized by the color purpose and a festival season symbolized by the color white. After each cycle there is an ordinary time of growth symbolized by the color green. Thus, there is a sequence of seasons using purple, white and green in that order twice each year. (The United Methodist Book of Worship, Copyright © 1992. The United Methodist Publishing House.)

- Purple, representing both royalty and penitence, is traditionally used during Advent and Lent.
- **Blue** symbolizes hope and may also be used during Advent.
- White and Gold are used at Christmas and Easter to symbolize joy and festivities.
- Red symbolizes the color of fire to represent the Holiday spirit on the Day of Pentecost and times when the work of the Holy Spirit is emphasized. During Holy Week it represents the observances such as Memorial Day and Thanksgiving.
- Green represents growth and is used during Ordinary Time (the season after Epiphany and the season after Pentecost.)






