"FASTING"

Fasting is one of the spiritual disciplines that Jesus implied that His disciples would practice (Matthew 6:16-18; 9:14,15) and a discipline that John Wesley identified as a "means of grace". John Wesley defined "means of grace" as "outward signs, words, or actions, ordained of God, and appointed for this end, to be the ordinary channels whereby He might convey to men, prevenient (*anticipation*), justifying, or sanctifying grace".

According to author Steve Harper, Wesley believed that fasting contributed to one's spiritual growth.

John Wesley stressed the connection between fasting and prayer.





LENT

Lent is a solemn religious observance that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends six weeks later, before Easter Sunday. The purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer through prayer, doing penance, repentance of sins, almsgiving, atonement, and self-denial. Many Christians commit to fasting or giving up certain types of luxuries as a form of penance. Christians may also add a Lenten spiritual discipline such a reading a daily devotional.


